## **1 Welcome and introduction**

The President introduced himself as the new GNB-CPD President, and his two colleagues Mrs Jana Curdova and Mr Jozef Pobis as the new Full and Alternate members for the Czech Republic.

No-one from the Commission attended the meeting. Mr Klein and Mr Katsarakis sent their apologies, and stated that they still considered the GNB-CPD important.

## **2 Approval of the draft Agenda**

**NB-CPD/07/257r3**

The draft agenda was approved.

## **3 Draft Minutes of 20th Advisory Group meeting NB-CPD/06/242**

No comments or requests for changes were received and the minutes were accepted.

**CONCLUSION** - Minutes approved.

## **4 Matters arising from minutes not dealt with on the Agenda and actions still outstanding after 20th Advisory Group meeting**

**NB-CPD/07/259**

The only action on CPD TechSec that has not been completed and does not appear elsewhere on the Agenda is item 8E, uploading a revised FAQ document. Our new President decided it would not be appropriate to post these on a website, due to possible liabilities. CPD TechSec will retain the FAQs and their answers as a resource for answering individual questions that might be submitted. Questions that are posed frequently, and their answers, may be consolidated into Advisory Group position papers.

## **5 Dates of next meetings**

**CONCLUSION** - The next (22<sup>nd</sup>) GNB-CPD AG meeting was confirmed as Tuesday 2 October 2007, and will be held in Brussels.

- The 23<sup>rd</sup> GNB-CPD AG meeting was set provisionally for Tuesday 11 March 2008, and will be probably be held in Prague.

## **6 Report on SCC and Commission matters**

### **6A Clarifying Commission responsibilities**

Some of the actions minuted under item 6A arose during discussion of subsequent parts of item 6.

No-one was present to represent the Commission. The President had written to the Commission asking who is now responsible for areas relating to the GNB-CPD. He has not received an answer, but understands that Mr Katsarakis is to be responsible at least temporarily. He has arranged to meet Mr Klein and Mr Katsarakis 25 April 2007, and will ask about responsibilities at the meeting.

- ACTION**
- GNB-CPD President to ask, either at the next SCC meeting, 19/20 April 2007, or at his meeting with the Commission 25 April 2007, for the minutes of SCC meetings to be made available shortly after each meeting.
  - GNB-CPD President to ask the Commission about GNB-CPD responsibilities at the meeting 25 April 2007.
  - CPD TechSec to compile a list of issues that the GNB-CPD needs the Commission to resolve, in the form of an official letter requesting a reply in writing, and circulate it for comment.
  - GNB-CPD President to send the letter and raise the issues with the Commission at their meeting.

## **6B Revision of the New and Global Approach NB-CPD/07/266 & 266a-f**

The President gave a presentation on the revision of the New and Global Approach, to be uploaded as NB-CPD/07/270, which gives key points of the proposals. He stated that no discussion of this issue was permitted at Preparatory Group (PG) as the Commission's Construction Unit is not preparing the New Approach proposals. EUROLAB has represented NBs in discussions. The position has changed dramatically since Mr Leoz-Argüelles spoke at the previous GNB-CPD meeting. It is now expected that the CPD will be included in the revised legislation for the New and Global Approach. The key proposal is Commission document COM(2007) 53 final "Proposal for a Decision of the European Parliament and of the Council on a common framework for the marketing of products", uploaded as NB-CPD/07/266f. Discussion indicated a range of concerns, although the proposals should bring improvements in some areas such as market surveillance.

- CONCLUSION**
- The GNB-CPD needs to respond and should do so quickly. The GNB-CPD should seek common ground with groups such as NORMAPME, FIEC and designers.

- ACTIONS**
- CPD TechSec to upload presentation NB-CPD/07/270 on CIRCA.
  - CPD TechSec to find who is the appropriate contact in the Commission on the New Approach for the President to write to.
  - AG members to circulate the proposals nationally.
  - AG members to email their proposals towards a GNB-CPD document to CPD TechSec by 30 March 2007.
  - CPD TechSec to draft a document for discussion, with GNB-CPD President, in the form of an official letter, by 5 April 2007, for circulation amongst AG members prior to submission to the Commission, and circulation to industry representatives, etc.
  - President to discuss representations on the New Approach with NORMAPME, FIEC, etc at suitable opportunities.

## **6C Study on the effectiveness of the CPD**

**NB-CPD/07/268**

The President introduced discussion on the PRC report on its study on the effectiveness of the CPD (uploaded on CIRCA as NB-CPD/07/264a-c). There was the widespread agreement that the report

misrepresented NBs and the value of third party approvals. Although the Commission is no longer seeking an acceptable final version of the report, members were concerned that the last version of the report might reappear in future. NB-CPD/07/268 was considered not to be sufficiently critical of the report.

<b>ACTION</b>	- CPD TechSec to redraft NB-CPD/07/268 with an introduction that states that in the GNB-CPD's opinion the conclusions of the PRC report with respect to NBs are not substantiated and so are misleading, for submission to the Commission by the GNB President.

## 6D NANDO – notification matters - notification for calculation

Mrs Ima Gómez López had written to the President announcing that although she no longer worked in the Commission's Construction Unit, she was still operating the NANDO database, and would assist if necessary.

The President and members had serious concerns with the current NANDO system. There is no process for removing out-of-date notifications unless the NB needs to update other notifications, when the system recognizes existing errors. The current system is not helpful for users seeking NBs for particular tasks, or searching which tasks a particular body is notified for. Many of the problems arise because the system shows bodies notified to a standard, but does not indicate which particular tests under that standard the body is notified for.

<b>ACTIONS</b>	- Members to email their proposals for improvements required to NANDO to CPD TechSec by 30 March 2007. - CPD TechSec to consolidate proposals for the President's meeting with the Commission 25 April 2007.

## 6E Interpretation of attestation of conformity systems (SCC)

This item was addressed after item 6C.

The Commission has not responded to the GNB-CPD's comments on Commission paper CONSTRUCT 06/761, given in NB-CPD/06/246 which includes CONSTRUCT 06/761. The issues were not discussed at PG.

<b>ACTIONS</b>	- CPD TechSec to distribute CONSTRUCT 06/761 to SG officials, requesting them where needed to prepare position papers to achieve equivalent working in line with CONSTRUCT 06/761 to standards with cumulative AoC levels. - President to press the Commission to maintain the requirement for a manufacturer's declaration of conformity under all AoC systems, and for SCC to resolve the issue of cumulative AoC levels at their meeting 25 April 2007.

## 6F Article 5(1) cases

This item was taken with 6A in a report by the President on the PG meeting.

The Commission has confirmed that burglary resistance is not a requirement within the CPD and thus is not in the harmonized parts of the standards.

The Commission is preparing draft decisions to withdraw the following standards at the request of individual Member States although most other Member States oppose this, because the Commission does not have a more flexible tool than withdrawal:

- EN 494:2004 "Fibre-cement profiled sheets and fittings - Product specification and test methods";
- EN 1457:1999 "Chimneys - Clay/Ceramic Flue Liners - Requirements and test methods"  
EN 1857:2003 "Chimneys - Components - Concrete flue liners"

Member States also gave early warning of concerns with the following standards:

- EN 14716 Stretched ceilings (Sweden)
- EN 10138-1 Prestressing steels (Germany)
- EN 858-1 Separator systems for light liquids,  
EN 1334 Plastic tanks for above ground storage of domestic heating oils &  
EN 14041 Resilient, textile and laminate floor coverings (France)
- EN 1341 Stone paving slabs,  
EN 1342 Stone paving setts,  
EN 1343 Stone paving kerbs,  
EN 12591 Paving grade bitumens,  
EN 1090-1 Steel and aluminium structural components (Finland)
- EN 14604 Smoke alarm devices (France)
- EN 14081-1 Strength graded structural timber (France, Belgium & Austria)

## 7 Development of AG guidance and agreed viewpoint

### 7A Rebranding and sub-contract manufacture NB-CPD/06/217r2

Peter Corkish introduced the revised draft AG position paper on rebranding and sub-contract manufacture. Several Sector Groups have been seeking guidance on this issue. After much discussion it was resolved that AG should provide guidance. However, §6, giving guidance on subcontracting arrangements between NBs, should be removed from the paper, either to be omitted or considered for a further position paper.

Mr Vinci requested that it be minuted that AG was agreed that all NBs should follow good practice in this area.

### 7B Minimum and recommended ITT report content and GNB model test report NB-CPD/06/214r1

Chris Newman introduced the revised draft AG position paper giving minimum and recommended ITT report content, and a model text report. After discussion it was agreed that CPD TechSec should continue to develop the paper. §2.3 should be modified to indicate that the test laboratory is not normally responsible for sampling, unless the task had been delegated to it. It should be more clear that the model test report is an example for guidance; NBs should always follow any guidance in the standards they are working to. If the standards give no guidance NBs remain free to produce reports in a different format to the model provided they include the required content.

### 7C GNB model inspection report NB-CPD/06/215r2

Chris Newman introduced the revised draft AG position paper giving a model inspection report. After discussion it was agreed that CPD TechSec should continue to develop the paper. It should be more clear that the model inspection report is an example for guidance; NBs should always follow any guidance in the

standards they are working to. If the standards give no guidance NBs remain free to produce reports in a different format to the model.

Mr Höhnli requested that CPD TechSec circulate the existing checklist. CPD TechSec assume this is a reverence to the published AG position paper NB-CPD/AG/03/004 "Checklists for initial inspection of factory and factory production control and continuous surveillance of factory production control" referred to in NB-CPD/06/215r2.

## **7D The consequences for NBs of corrigenda, amendments and revisions to harmonized European standards NB-CPD/06/213r1**

During the discussion, it was agreed that, contrary to the previous majority opinion followed by NB-CPD/06/213r1, NBs shall revise their certificates whenever the latest version of a harmonized standard cited in the OJ changes, whether the change is due to a revision, amendment or corrigendum.

## **7E Report and demonstration of GNB-CPD Test Website NB-CPD/07/258**

Dr Peter Corkish introduced the GNB-CPD website and showed key pages from the site including a simplified implementation of the monitoring tool on the GNB-CPD Test Website. Currently a little used spreadsheet version has been available on CIRCA for several years. CPD TechSec stated that the current effort to maintain the spreadsheet version of the monitoring tool was disproportionate to the use being made of the tool by GNB-CPD members. To develop and maintain the tool for widespread use means using the GNB-CPD website and this would require much of the resources of CPD TechSec and could not be justified. CPD TechSec sought agreement from AG that the current monitoring tool is dropped, and that effort is directed instead to developing a reporting and planning tool on the work of SGs – no objections were raised.

## 8 SG Matters

### NB-CPD/07/263 and NB-CPD/M03 Feb 2007

Dr Peter Corkish introduced the items 8A and 8B together. CPD TechSec said they had concerns that the level of scrutiny of the papers, other than by CPD TechSec, was now less than before because of the larger number of papers AG members were expected to read and that because CEN consultants were less likely to read and comment on the papers. To address this CPD TechSec suggested the following, to which there were no objections:

- CPD TechSec to study more closely the papers before they are sent out and to highlight potentially contentious matters for AG members;
- AG members should (continue to) consult with NBs and others in their country to ensure that their views were discussed and accommodated in the papers, and;
- CPD TechSec should have greater discretion to approve revised papers on behalf of AG without them having to be formally circulated to AG members - ie either papers already approved which the SG wishes to change and matters are not contentious, or those already commented on by AG members and returned to SGs for changes.

<b>ACTION</b>	- CPD TechSec to exercise more discretion in approving, on behalf of AG and without circulation, non-contentious revisions to papers and papers which address matters AG has previously commented on.

## 9 National Mirror Group Matters

### NB-CPD/06/237r1

France reported, amongst other matters, that a few SGs were dominated by industry representatives. CPD TechSec said they were aware that in one or two SGs the number of associates (industry associations and CEN/TC liaisons) out-numbered the number of NBs attending the SG meetings and that so far this had not resulted in guidance papers which reflected undue pressure/bias, but it was a situation that needed monitoring and discreet intervention when suspected.

The paper (NB-CPD/06/237r1) from the UK National Mirror Group was briefly discussed. It highlight conflicts between GP M and current GNB guidance NB/CPD/AG/03/005 regarding testing using the facilities of the manufacturer. It was agreed that the GNB guidance should not conflict with GP M, but it should not seek to encourage the use of manufacturer's facilities where it can be avoided and more reliable testing be undertaken using the facilities of the NB.

## **12B Call for research ideas in support of standardization**

**NB-CPD/07/267r1**

The President suggested that more research was needed to support Eurocodes and work towards harmonising building regulations. France suggested research to support control of conformity of product.

**ACTION** - AG members were asked to respond by email to the President and CPD TechSec by 5 April 2007.

## **12C Other matters**

At the start of the meeting, France raised the matter of Construct 06/761 which raised many significant matters regarding the CPD including that GPs had no legal significance. The President responded saying that there had been no further developments regarding the paper and that the forthcoming SCC meeting on 19 and 20 April may see developments. The legal position of GPs and GNB-CPD position papers has not changed, ie they are administrative ways agreed between MSs to implement common understandings and requirements of the CPD.
